this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following
I leave all my Stock of all kinds and all my house hold and furniture
to be sold and my just debts to be paid
Then, after my just debts are paid the remainder I am to be equally divided
among my land & Negroes to be equally divided between my wife, Margaret Carstarphen
and son John Carstarphen and David Carstarphen & Margaret Carstarphen
to them and their heirs for ever
I also appoint My Wife Margaret Carstarphen and Arthur Bowing & Mica-
Griffin my whole and sole Executors to this my last Will & Testament made
this 26th day of November 1799.

In the name of God Amen I Richard Norrell of the County of
Southampton being sick & in a very low state of health at present in body
but in perfect sense & memory in mind do make and devise this my last Will
and Testament in manner & form as followeth -
First, I give unto my Loving Wife, Tabitha Norrell the use of the plantation
whereon I now live containing 150 Acres of Land more or less, during her
natural Life, also one Feather Bed and furniture, Also one Mare & 3 head
of cattle, and 4 Sheep, and also all my Stock of Hogs, also my still & wood
Cup - also all my Pater and potts also two barrels of Apple Brandy during her
natural Life, and no more, and at the death of my Wife I give the same to my son
Richard Norrell him and his heirs forever.

Now all the remainder of my Estate, after paying my just debts I give to my
son Richard Norrell to him and his heirs forever, And if my son Richard
Norrell should die without an heir I give my Estate to be equally divided
between Shadrach Norrell William Norrell and Elisha Council to them and
their heirs forever.

Then, I also give unto my Wife, Tabitha Norrell 15 barrels of Indian Corn
and no more.

And I also do appoint Arthur Bowing and Micaiah Griffin jun^r my heirs and sole
Executors to this my last Will and Testament made this 12th Day of October 1799.
