 and constitute this my last Will and Testament in form and Manner following to wit.

I give and bequeath unto my Wife Rebecca during her life or widowhood two feather Beds &
 Furniture and after her Death or Marriage I give one of the said Beds & Furniture ~~and after her death~~
 to my Grandson Elepha Williams I also give unto my said Wife Rebecca during her life or widowhood
 the following articles to wit one large Chest two large Dishes two basons six plates six spoons one punch bowl
 one pint cup one butter pott two jugs six bottles two spinning Wheels one flax Hackel one box iron & stealer
 one Iron pot hooks and rack four Knives & forks four Sider Casks two cows & calves one sow & pigs one Table
 one small Box one Saddle two Oxen and Lambs four Chairs one tub Pail & piggon one looking glass one Box
 and two ten Trays & Search.

As to the Remainder of my Estate real and personal after payment of my debts and Legacies
 I give and bequeath the same unto my Son Robert & his heirs for ever hereby revoking and annulling
 all other wills by me heretofore & confirming this and none other to be my last will & Testament In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 14th day of July 1783
