- In the Name of God Amen I John Moghamre of the County of Southampton
and State of Virginia being in health and perfect in my Mind Memory and understand-
ing but knowing the Mortal State of all Men and to prevent all contention
after my Departure I have thought fit to point this my last Will and Testamen-
tary I have unto my Wife Sally the use of my plantation and all the utensils belong-
ing thereto with all my stock of every kind During her Life or widowhood and
to Negroes Cyprian Jagers Silas Sue Sam —
I give and bequeath unto my Son John after his Mothers Death all my Land
and plantation and likewise my Negroes namely Jager Abram Sam and all my Livestock
from the Drought hereof, to him and his heirs for ever —
I have unto my Daughter Sally Whitson one Negro Boy call'd David and fifty
pounds during her Natural Life, and then to be Equally divided among all
her Children —
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Betty Bailey two Negroes to wit Perry
James to her and to her heirs forever —
I give and bequeath to my Daughter Betty one horse call'd Albion one feather bed
and furniture and two Negroes to wit Silas and Sue after the death of her Mother
and to the heirs Lawfully begotten of her Body —
I give and bequeath provided she shall live to come of age a Negro girl call'd Lily and
heirs for ever to my Grand Daughter Nancy Sunday —
My Will is that my Negro Man Cyprian shall be free at the death of my wife —
My will is that all the rest of my Estate shall be equally Divided between my Son
John Betty & Betty and I do point my son John Executor of this my last Will
and be revoking all former Wills. Thereby do declare and pronounce this to be my
Last Will and Testament in Witness I have of I have hereunto set my hand
and seal my seal this fiftenth Day of May one Thousand seven hundred and
Ninety Seven —
