

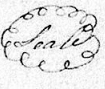
To my son Thomas Summrell and his heirs forever I give and bequeath the house now

 Branch or any three of them make partition and division of my lands between my
 two sons before mentioned in case they should disagree. —

To my Daughter Nancy Boole I give and bequeath a negro girl named Violet to her and
 her heirs forever on her husband's paying unto my daughter Milly the sum of
 twenty pound Virginia money and in case he should refuse so to do then I give and
 bequeath the said negro girl to my said daughter Milly to her and her heirs forever
 To my daughter Mary and to her heirs forever I give and bequeath a negro girl named
 Sarah —

To my son Heerd and to his heirs forever I give and bequeath a negro boy named Jack
 After the death ^{or marriage} of my wife my will and desire is that all the remainder of my estate be
 sold by my executors at public auction and the money arising from such sale be equally
 divided between all my children then living or their representatives —

I do hereby nominate and appoint my two sons William and Thomas Executors of
 this my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made
 In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 1 day of Feb^r 1777

At a court held for the county of Southampton the 20th day
 of October 1780 — This Will was presented in court by Thomas Summrell one of the
 Exors named in the will the others refusing — and having been affirmed to by Joseph
 Jones one of the people Called Quakers and the hand Writing of John David Houf-
 man one of the subscribing witnesses thereto having been sworn to and ordered
 to be recorded — On the motions of said exor. who made oath according to Law
 Probate is granted him on giving bond and Security —
