In the name of God Amen I Jacob Joyner of the County of Southampton and parish of Stotoway being weak in body but of perfect sound sense and memory thanks be to the almighty God for the same, do think proper to dispose of such worldly goods and chattels as it hath been pleased God to bestow on me in the following manner and form -

I give I bequeath unto my son Jacob Joyner two hundred acres land whereon the said Jacob now lives to be laid off adjoining the lands of the estate of John Gardner which said lands is to be surveyed at the expence of my son Jacob to him and his heirs & assigns power also thirty shillings Cash which shall be his full share of my Estate

I give and bequeath to my son Jordan Joyner all the plantation and lands I live on not yet disposed of supposed to contain two hundred and ninety acres to him and to his heirs and assigns forever also my handy stile &c together with all my estate of all kinds never not yet disposed of Except as shall be hereafter Except to him and his heirs and assigns for ever -

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Beal one pound ten shillings current Money which shall be her full share of my estate -

I give to my Daughter Sarah Council Three pounds current Money which shall be her full share of my estate

and Lastly - I do hereby request that no appraisement be on my Estate and do depute constitute appoint and ordain my son Jordan Joyner whole and Sole Executor of this my last will and testament revoking and annulling all former will heretofore made by me and do Acknowledge this only to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of December 1800
