

213 and my mahogany Desk & Book Case; I likewise give him my said Grand son, my silver watch; but in case he should die before the provisions above mentioned, then their abovementioned Slaves & the bequest of every kind, as recited are to revert and be accounted as part of my residuary estate hereafter mentioned.

I give to the Sons of Benjamin Peete, by name Samuel, Thomas & Benjamin Blunt Peete the sum of Six hundred & forty five pounds cash & also John Wrights Bond for three hundred pounds, all of which is to be equally divided between them immediately put out to Interest.

I give unto my grandson Alexander Peete to him and his heirs forever the tract of Land and plantation whereon I now Live Containing Six hundred and thirty five acres be the same more or less; but Nevertheless one half of said Land is subject to the free use of my Wife during her natural Life as above mentioned. I also give unto my Grandson Alexander Peete John Wrights Bond for the sum of Two hundred and nineteen pounds Six Shillings & nine pence also George Blow Bond for Eighty three pounds fourteen Shillings, and Littlebury Masons Bond for fourteen pounds Twelve Shillings and five pence.

I give unto my son Benjamin Peete and his heirs, Christman and her children which he already has in possession.

I give unto my son Thomas Peete to him and his heirs forever the following tracts of Land (viz^t) The Tract that I purchased of John Applewhite containing two hundred and fifty eight and an half acres and the two tracts of Land I purchased of Ephraim Ivy one containing Sixty eight acres lying in the county of Southampton and adjoining the Land I purchased of John Applewhite the other Tract lying in the county of Suffolk adjoining the lands of Littlebury Mason and containing one hundred acres and also my bay colt got by the Clocky Diamon I save the any Slaves Horses and Stock of all kinds may be kept together during the present year for the purpose of making a crop and at the close thereof to be divided as the will direct at which time I give unto my said Wife Mary one third part of all and every part of the crop that shall be made on the lands which I now possess.

I give the remainder and residue of my estate of whatsoever, or whosoever found to my two Sons Benjamin and Thomas Peete to be equally divided between them if practicable but in case a just and equitable division cannot be made and affected by my executor hereafter to be named that then he shall proceed to make sale of the said residuary estate to the highest bidder giving a credit of twelve Months and the money arising from said sale to be equally divided between the said Benjamin and Thomas Peete and their heirs.

Lastly I do constitute and appoint my friend Samuel Blunt Executor of this my Last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set
