5th I give and Bequeath to my Cousin Anselm Bailey j^r fifteen pounds cash
which I desire him to except as a mark of the sense I have of his regard and
tender attention on me in the course of my Ina disposition —

6th All the Remainder part of my Estate of every kind whatsoever I desire
may be equally Divided Betwixt my Nephews Sam^l & Thomas Pittow
(Son of Thomas Pittow)

7th I constitute and appoint my brother in law Thomas Pittow & my cousin
Anselm Bailey j^r to be my hole & sole Ex^{rs} of this my last will &
Testament revoking and disallowing all former wills and bequests
by me made in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this twenty six Day of the fourth month
Ans domini one thousand eight hundred & two
