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I give unto my Daughter Family Joiner, Negroe Wilkes, Miles and Miles, and also the sum of Twenty Dollar, to her and to her heirs forever. I desire that all my Estate not before mentioned may be sold by my Executors hereafter named. and the money arising from such sale, I give to be equally divided amongst all my children, and their heirs as such of them as then be. I desire that if either of my sons should die before they arrive to the age of twenty one year, that the estate now will go to him my go to his surviving Brother, and if both my sons should die in their nonage, that then the estate should go to my Daughter or their heirs or such of them as then be. If either of my Daughter should die without Issue and under twenty One year of age, I desire that the estate now will go to her may be divided amongst all my children or their heirs, or such of them as then be.

I lend unto my loving wife Elizabeth Joiner, the use of the dwelling house where I now live, and ten acres of Land around the same, (during her natural life or widowhood) to be paid to her out of the profits of my estate, in case she should remain a widow until my estate is to be divided amongst my children, as herein directed that then each child shall before receiving the legacy herein expressed enter into bond with security for the punctual annual payment of their proportion of the said sum of Fifty Dollar. I desire that this legacy may be considered as in lieu of dowry, and that it may bar her (my Wife Elizabeth) from and every other right, or title, she may claim, to my estate or any part thereof. I give unto my Executors hereafter named right to apply such part of my estate, as they may think proper, to the education of my children or any of them, provided they do not touch land or negroes. I do appoint my friends Bay. a. Blunt, and Richard Blunt, Executors of this my Last Will and Testament.
