part of Estate be sold to the highest bidder by my Executors and Equ-
ally Divided amongst all my children hereafter to be named
Gunn, Stephenson, Lucy, John Joshua, Mary, and
Dunsey, to them and their heirs forever.

I now I point my Loving wife. And Josiah Johnson and Stephenson
Blake Executors of this my Last Will and Testament Defining
all other Wills by me made and do declare this to be my Last
will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
