I, Arthur Waller of Brampton County and Parish of St. Lukes being
in perfect Sense and Sound disposition, mind, thanks be given to almighty
God for the same, do make and constitute declare this to be my last
Will and Testament in manner and form following —

I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Levi Waller four Negroes
named (old) Dick Ben. Dave and Jane to him and his heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Drury Waller, the plan-
tation whereon I now live with all the lands adjoining and thereon
named James Dick Jane and Charlotte her and his heirs forever

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Polly John son two
Negroes named Joan and Mingo and if she should die without a
living child of her body the said Negroes is to return to Levi &
Drury Waller, them and their heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Lucy Waller two
Negroes named Peter and Wan and if she die without a living child
of her body the said Negroes is to return to Levi and Drury Waller
them and their heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Rebecca Mary
the Negro named Ahahome the said Negro not to be carried out of
this County but the said Negro to be hired annually by Grandson
Drury Waller for the Support of her Children —

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Patsy Waller Daugh-
ter of Drury Waller, one Negro boy named Anthony if she die without
a living child of her body the said Negro boy to return to Drury
Waller son of said Drury —

I give and bequeath unto my two Grand Sons Levi and Drury
Waller all the horses I am possessed with at my death to be equally
divided between them —

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Drury Waller the
estate I am now possessed with standing of my plantation him
and his heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my Grand son Levi Waller Twenty pounds
in money arising from the stock not mentioned

I also give my two Grandsons a my plantation Attenuals to be equa-
lly divided between them —

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Lucy Waller &
Rebekah one bed & a piece at my death —

I leave my Stock to be sold excepting the horses and the money
before mentioned to be sold and equally divided between my
five Grand children after paying my debts &c
