my son Henry B. Vaughan and Howse Vaughan -
my wife and devise is that the money & Debts I now have by
me be appropriated to the discharge of my Debts, And for the
Execution of this my last will and Testament I appoint Maj^r
Thos^r Vaughan and Wm. Humphrey Executors - In witness
whereof I have unto Set my hand this 10th day of April 1803
