two young daughters Polly Long & Catherine Long shall have the
fifteen pounds to be equally divided -

I give to my young Son Joseph Thorp Son of William Thorp eight
pounds in case he dies before he comes to lawful age or without I give
a legacy and devise is that my Son Timothy Thorp & his
heirs shall have the eight pounds -

my wife & survivor is that the whole of my estate not before given or devised
shall be sold and just debts paid out of the money arising from the
sale the balance mentioned Legacies legacies paid and the balance
if any to be equally divided among my children viz
Lucy Cheak Timothy Thorp Lucy Long & Mary Thorp -

my wife and survivor is that the money and property left to my
daughters Lucy Long & Grandson James & Anne to be left in
the care of my friend Humphrey Dewey to be advised to them
as he thinks best - - -

Lastly I do appoint my friend Humphrey Dewey Executor of this
my last will and testament in the trusts whereof I have here
into set my hand & Affixed my seal this day and year
as above written -
