and purposes void -

I Give unto my son Henry Pitman the whole of my land to him and
his heirs forever - I do hereby appoint my brother Mosehizicks Pitman
and my friend John Clayton Sur. my executors to this my last will & testament
Given under my hand & seal this the 15 day June in the Year of our Lord
One thousand eight hundred Three
