 or whatsoever I may, to educate and support my children on and after the
 decease of my wife, and live and bequeath as follows - (W^m)
 I give and bequeath to my son Elijah Hollman (after the death of
 my wife, one negro boy named Jack) to him and his heirs forever -
 I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Hollman (after the death of my
 wife, one negro boy named Jack) to him and his heirs forever -
 I give and bequeath to my son William Hollman (after the death of
 my wife, one negro boy named Sam) to him and his heirs forever -
 I give unto my daughter Polly Hollman one bed & furniture, to hold
 her heirs forever -
 I give & bequeath to my daughter Lucy Hollman, one bed & furniture
 to her and her heirs forever -
 My desire is that the above mentioned negro woman Lydia be sold, & the
 out for my use & her after named shall think best, and the money arising from the
 sale or hire of the s^d negro Lydia, I lend to my s^d wife to support her self and
 my children (herein named) on -
 My further will and desire is, that after the death of my wife, that all my
 estate of what nature & kind soever I may except what is bequeathed
 devised or sold - and out of the money arising from the s^d things, that three
 fifth parts to my daughter Polly and Lucy Hollman each of a Legacy of
 fifty pounds, and the remainder to be equally divided among all my
 children namely Polly Hollman, Lucy Hollman, Elijah Hollman
 Samuel Hollman and Wm Hollman, which s^d money I give to my s^d wife
 to pay to them as and when she shall think best, and my further desire is that if either
 of my children shall die before he or she shall be of age, that the money
