In the name of God Amen, I W<sup>m</sup> Holloman of the County of S<sup>t</sup>. C<sup>t</sup>  
and parish of St. Lukes being in sound & disposing sense and memory  
do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following  
Item I leave to my wife Rebecca Holloman during her natural life and  
negro woman named Lydia, and three negro boys named Jim, Jack  
and Sam, as also all the remainder of my estate of what nature or kind so ever  
of whatsoever found, to educate and support my children as and after the  
decease of my wife, and leave and bequeath as follows - (P.S.)  
Item I give and bequeath to my son Elijah Holloman (after the death of  
my wife, one negro boy named Jerry) to him and his heirs forever -  
Item I give and bequeath to my son James Holloman (after the death of  
my wife, one negro boy named Jack) to him and his heirs forever -  
Item I give and bequeath to my Son William Holloman (after the death of  
my wife, one negro boy named Sam, to him and his heirs forever -  
Item I give unto my Daughter Polly Holloman one hundred Pounds, to her  
use and benefit forever -  
Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Lucy Holloman, her use & benefit  
to her and her heirs forever -  
Item I beseech you that the above mentioned negro woman Lydia who died  
out of my estate but after named shall think best, and the money arising from the  
sale or hire of the said negro Lydia, I leave to my wife to support her self and  
my children herein named, or -

My further will and desire is, that after the death of my wife, that all my  
estate of what nature or kind so ever or wheresoever found except what is hereto  
named to sold, and out of the money arising from the same all thereof, that the  
first part to my Daughter Polly and Lucy Holloman each of a legacy of  
Fifty pounds, and the remainder to be equally divided among all my  
children namely Polly Holloman, Lucy Holloman, Elijah Holloman  
James Holloman and W<sup>m</sup> Holloman which sum I give to my wife  
children to be distributed by will and desire further is that if unto
