 I Give to my son John Williams all my time wood land 150 Acres
 more or less all within the improved land,
 I Give to my son Arthur Williams the Ten Brounley land and one neck out of
 the mained Plantations land being the 1st land bounded with or branch to
 the line by the corner of Rich^d Beabers being the hundred and twenty four
 man or less
 I Give to my son W^m Williams the mained plantation above now 150 two hundred
 more or less
 I Give to my son Rob^t Williams fifty pounds to be made out of the mained
 Estate
 I Give to my wife Ann Williams one negro fellow named Elvies one bed
 -inter & Chute & trunk to the S^r had her being
 I leave John Williams & W^m Fowler Executors to my will June 14th 1788
