In the name of God Amen, I Moses Foster of Southampton  
County being of sound mind and disposing will and memory do make  
this to be my last will and testament after recommending my soul  
to God that gave it and my body to be decently buried at the discretion  
of my Executors hereafter mentioned and as to my worldly goods I give  
of inform and manner following.

I give and bequeath unto William Foster son of testing Foster my  
Small tract of Land on the Southside of the three Creeks adjoining Thomas  
Ridley and Arthur Turner to him and his heirs forever —

Item I give unto Elizabeth Blanton the use of my Land and plantation where  
on I now live all my Negroes namely, Jack the Elder, Jack Knop Cusus  
Fanny Mima Avery, Charlotte, Patrick Selvy Edie Fanny & Nelly  
my Stock of all Kinds households and kitchen furniture toge  
ther with all the residue of my Estate of what ever nature  
or kind it may consist of after paying all my just debts  
until the said Elizabeth Blanton has another Child or until  
Polly Foster Blanton should be Married, in either of those  
cases or when either shall take place the said Elizabeth Blanton
