I Richard Wren of Southampton County Virginia being of a sound disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following --

First

I give unto my son Evans Wren five Shillings Cash

2^{dly}

I give unto my Daughter Sally Wren one Feather Bed and furniture one Cow and Calf one heifer also two pewter dishes one basin one dozen Earthen Plates to be delivered into her Possession when she arrives to lawful age or Marries --

3^{dly}

I give the use of the Plantations whereon I now live with the Land thereto belonging to my wife during her life and at her death to descend to my son William Wren and his heirs forever direct and require that all my Estate of every Kind and denomination not already devised be continued in the hands of my wife during her Widowhood for the support and maintenance of her & my above said Daughter Sally -- And at the expiration of her Widowhood or death for the same or what ever may then be found to be equally divided between my two Daughters Suckey Johnson and Sally Wren

4^{thly}

I desire that there may be no appraisement of my Estates

Lastly

I nominate and appoint my son William Wren and my son in law Zachariah Johnson sole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament In witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 12th day of the sixth month in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and three
