Hampton County being in perfect mind and memory knowing it appointed for me to make one last will and testament do make and appoint this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows (Viz) — I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Porter, my Loom, Bars and Wapping Boxes also I give my Daughter Eliza, Porter the sum of eighteen Dollars to purchase her a saddle, also I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Porter my youngest son a filly — Also I give unto my son James Brantly one grey mare one Bed and furniture and one Cow and calf one sow and pigs, also I give my son James Brantly one negro man named Gabriel, also I give unto my son Cordell Brantly one bay horse one bed and furniture, one Cow and calf one sow and pigs, and I give unto my son Cordell Brantly my large Chest Also I give unto my daughter Lucy Hart one Bay Coat one bed and furniture one Cow and calf also, Also I give unto my grand daughter Polly Porter, one Bed and furniture also I give her the sum of twenty Dollars to be raised out of my Estate the balance of my Estate I wish to be sold to pay my debts and after that the balance of Money left is to be equally divided between my Children and I do appoint my son Thomas Porter and Cordell Brantly to be whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament disallowing all other wills & Testament and pronouncing ratifying and confirming this to be my last will & none other In Wit-
