 mortal body do make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament in
 the following manner and form and First I Give that all my lawfull Debts
 and burial charges be paid out of my estate the remainder of my estate
 I dispose of in the ~~following~~ ^{following} =

Item I Give and bequeath to my son John Woodward the land and Plantation where
 on Shores lives being a part of and adjoining the plantation whereon Snow
 lives, divided by a line running thro' my plantation and containing by
 Estimation twenty five acres more or less, and lying on the South side to him
 and his heirs forever =

Item I Give and bequeath to my son Samuel Woodward the land whereon Snow lives being the
 North side of my plantation, after the death or marriage of my wife Temperance
 Woodward and I Give the S^d Land to her during her natural life or widowhood
 Also give my son Samuel Woodward one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

Item I Give and bequeath to Polly Carr the three head of Cattle which I have lent her
 already in her possession to gether with all articles which I have lent her now in
 her possession and the sum of ten Dollars current money to be paid out of my estate

Item I Give my daughter Martha Pope one feather bed and furniture to gether
 with what articles besides I have already lent her now in her possession
 to her and her heirs forever =

Item I Give my daughter Dicey Woodward three head of cattle one bed and
 furniture, I also give her my Riding Chair with this Exception that my beloved wife
 Temperance Woodward is to have the use of the Chair during her life and Dicey lives to
 gether ~~and~~ at the separation of my wife & Dicey the Chair to be long wholly
 to Dicey I also lend my move to my beloved wife during her life or widowhood &
 afterwards I give the move to my daughter Dicey Woodward I also give Dicey the Chair
 Harness with the chair =

Item the residue of my estate undisposed of, I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Temperance
 Woodward during her natural life or widowhood, and at her death or marriage I
 give the same to be equally divided between my two Daughters namely Martha
 Pope and Dicey Woodward, and Lastly I do Appoint my son John Woodward
 the sole executor to this my last will and testament In witness whereof I
 have unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 22^d day of July 1803
 Signed sealed published & Recorded by
 the testator to be his last will and testament
