being of Perfect sound mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this
mortal body do make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament in
the following manner and form and first I give that all my lawfull debts
and funeral charges be paid out of my estate the remainder of my estate
I dispose of in the following =

I give and bequeath to my son John Woodard the land and Plantation whereon
he now lives being a part of and Adjoining the plantation wheron I now
live divided by a line running thro' my plantation and containing by
Estimation forty five acres more or less, and lying on the South side to him
and his heirs forever =

I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Woodard the land wheron he now livt being the
North side of my plantation after the death or marriage of my wife Temperance
Woodard and I leave the 8th land to her during her natural life or widowhood
also giving son Samuel Woodard my feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever

I also give my daughter Polly Davis the time head of cattle which I have left her
already in her possession to go with all articles which I have left her now in
her possession and the sum of ten Dollars current money to be paid out of my estate

I also give my daughter Martha Pope my feather bed and furniture to go with
her with what other articles besides I have already left her have now in her possession
to her and her heirs forever =

I also give my daughter Dicy Woodard three head of cattle one bed and
furniture, also give her my Riding Chair with the carpet that my beloved wife
Temperance Woodard is to have the use of the Chair along aside and Dicy has to
soother stop at the separation of my wife & Dicy the chair to belong wholly
to Dicy I also lend my mare to my beloved wife during her life or widowhood &
afterwards I give the mare to my daughter Dicy Woodard also give Dicy the chair
furniture with the chair =

In the residue of my estate undispersed of, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Temperance
Woodard during her natural life or widowhood and at her death or marriage I
give the same to be equally divided between my two daughters namely Martha
Pope and Dicy Woodard, and lastly I do appoint my son John Woodard
the sole executor to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I do
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 22nd day of July 1803
