 God, calling unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
 That is to say— Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul
 into the hands of Almighty God that gave it and my body I recommend to the
 Earth to be buried in the decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my Beloved
 noting doubting but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again
 by the mighty power of God. And as touching such worldly Estate wherewith
 it hath pleased God to Bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose
 of the same in the following manner and form—

First I give and bequeath to my beloved son Peter Manney, one third of the Copseacre
 Field that shall be made, or sown on the plantation whereon I now
 =live, at my decease also, one half of my stock of hogs, Also I give and
 bequeath to my Daughter Margaret Barham one black mare and bay colt
 Also apine table, half dozen herring and Hake, and one pied heifer and the other
 half of my hogs to them and their heirs forever And I like wise constitute & ordain
 and Appoint Nathl^l Marks the sole Executor of this my last will and Testa-
 =ment— And I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke and disannul all and other former
 testament, wills, legacies, bequests and Executors by me in any wise before named
 wills and bequests, ratifying and Confirming this and nothing to be my last
 will and testament In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
 fourth day of March In the year of our Lord 1804
