 Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand daughter Polly English the sum of £5 to be raised out of my estate unto her, and her heirs forever—
 Item I give and bequeath unto Jesse English (Son of John) the other half of my land containing as above mentioned Also one negre Girl, by the name of Betsey one Bay mare, one Bull and my old Chest unto him and his heirs forever—
 Item My will and desire, is that After paying my Just Debts, and Funerals Expences that the whole of my estate of whatever kind it may consist in be divided, allotted and set apart by Sam^l Carbit, David Lawrence and Peterway Johnson and the Court in dividing the same Among Catherine John, and Jesse as here to be mentioned, And I do hereby disannul all, and every other will or will writings and manors whatsoever, in Writings Whereof I have herewith set my hand and seal the 3rd day of September Eighteen hundred and three—
