Constitute and Establish this my Last Will and Testament, in manner

and form following, Item the 1st I leave the use of half the land

and Plantations which I own like to my loving wife Sarah Johnson

also the use of my Dwelling House and Store, during her natural

life = Item the 2nd I give and bequeath unto my son John Johnson

the other half of my Land and Plantations and at the Death of

my said Son John Johnson have possession of all

said Land and Plantations, with the stock provisions he shall

pay, or come to be paid unto my said ^{three} Children, namely, Mary

Carr, Giles Johnson and Charity Johnson the sum of thirty

Pounds each, which money he shall pay at his own Expense

the same to him and his heirs forever = Item my said Son =

Item the 3rd I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Carr

one feather bed and furniture, which I have already sent her, and

one glass which I have sent her, and her heirs forever = Item the 4th I give and

bequeath unto my Son Giles Johnson all my Piney wood land

which my father gave me and that I bought of Benjamin Johnson;

also my old Gun unto him and his heirs forever = Item the 5th I give

and bequeath unto my Daughter Charity Johnson one feather bed

and furniture also one Loom, with all its Utensils, for mending

and weaving, unto her and her heirs forever = Item the 6th and last

I do hereby Appoint my friends Peter Johnson and Joseph Johnson

my true and Lawful Executors and desire they will raise as much money

from the old Stock as will pay my Just Debts and the remainder to

remain for the use of my said wife during her natural life and at

her Death the balance to be sold and Equally Divided between my

said Children namely Mary Carr, John Johnson, Giles Johnson and

Charity Johnson; Dividing likewise, and every other time or twice

Writing, or touching, or in any wise concerning the same, I do
