County being of Sound mind do make and ordain this as my Last
Will and Testament In manner following to Wit
I lend unto my beloved wife Mary during her natural life all my Estate
Consisting of my Lands negroes &c except so much of my live stock as my
Executors hereafter named may think unnecessary for my said wife to keep
at death of my said wife my will and desire is that all my Estate
Consisting of Lands negroes &c be sold by my Executors a Credit of Twelve
months and the money arising from Such Sale to be divided in
manner following viz.

I Give and bequeath unto my grand son Frankling son of Jesse Clark
Twenty Pounds to be applied towards his Education

I Give and bequeath unto my grand Children Eley Lucy and James
orphans of my son Edmund Clark one Eighth part of the remainder of
my Estate to be Equally divided amongst the three

I Give and bequeath all the remainder of my Estate to be Equally
divided amongst my Given Children viz John Clark Desey Spiteman
Jesse Clark William Clark Mary Vasser Lucretia Willoughby and Sally Williams
to them and their heirs forever.

Lastly I appointed my Son in law Etheldred Vasser my whole and sole Executor
to this my Last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto
Set my hand and affixed my Seal this 3rd day of November 1804
