In the name of God Amen this Twenty Eighth day of January one thousand Eight hundred and  
two I Martha Myrick of the County of Southampton being in perfect health and memory  
thanks be to God for the same and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die  
do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following  
first I desire to give my soul to God who gave it me and my Body to be decently buried  
the Discretion of my Exors and as touching what worldly goods I give and bequeath them  
in manner and form following.

Impressis

I give and bequeath unto my son James Myrick one new Feather Bed and Furniture also six new  
Cotton Sheets two White Counterpane more or one large walnut table one walnut Chest  
with feet to it three Dozen Earthen plates with green edges Two Head of Cattle three sows and piggs  
Eight Head of sheep Forty yards of white Cotton Cloth also one hundred and sixty pounds current  
money of Virginia but in case my son James Myrick dies under the age of twenty one years  
without lawfull Issue then my desire is that this legacy be equally divided between my  
then living children to them and their heirs forever

Item

I give and bequeath all the remaining part of my Estate of all kinds whatsoever to be  
equally divided between my Sons Edmund Myrick John Myrick David Myrick  
James Myrick Susan Myrick and Mary Ann wife to them and their heirs forever

and lastly I constitute and appoint my son Edmund Myrick and my Brother Saml Edmund  
whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament in Witness Where as I have  
hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the Day and year above written
