Will
Item 1. I give to my Daughter Anna Willons; one Hundred & Twenty five
Acres of Land; be the same more, or less to be laid off in the following
manner - to begin at Samuel Ponder line; at the mouth of a branch
Branch, up the S. Branch to a large Pond; known by the name of
the Huckle berry Pond, thence a straight line across the S. Branch
to John Norsworthy's line; - Also I give her one Negro Girl named
Dilley, one Cow & calf, one Feather Bed & Furniture, one Trunk
& Twenty five Dollars Cash, to her & to her Heirs & assigns
forever -

Item 2. I give to my Daughter Peggy Willons, my Negro Girl Jenty,
one Feather Bed, & Furniture, one Sow & Piggs, to be delivered
to her by my executors, when she arrives to the age of Twenty one
years - to her & her Heirs & assigns forever -

Item 3. I give to my Son William Bailey Willons, one half of my
tract of Land containing one Hundred & Eighty four Acres more
or less) near the head of the Horse pen Swamp which is to be
equally divided between my two Sons W. B. Willons & Willis Willons
when the said Willis arrives to the age of Twenty one years, as
they both may think proper, I also give to my Son William B.
Willons, one Feather Bed & Furniture & my new gun, one saddle
& Bridle, one Cow & calf, one Sow & Piggs, one ewe & Lamb
& my cross cut Saw, to him & to his heirs & assigns forever -

Item 4. I give to my Son William Willons, one half of my Land near
the head of the horse pen Swamp, containing one Hundred &
Eighty four Acres more or less to be divided as above, also
I give to him one Feather Bed & Furniture, my carpenters &
coopers Tools after the decease of my wife Mary, to him &
to his heirs and assigns forever -

I give to my Son Hartwell Willons, one Feather Bed and
Furniture, and one Hundred & Five pounds in Cash;
