- I Burwell Rollings of the County of Southampton knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, think fit to make my last will and Testament in the following manner (To wit,
- Item 1. I leave to my well beloved wife Polley the balance of my land after J^{sr} Burwell Rollings heirs part During her natural life or widowhood I leave the use of all my personal Estate except one feather Bed & furniture to my wife Polley during her natural life or widowhood —
- Item 2. I give to my son Robert Rollings one feather bed & furniture. I also leave to my aforesaid son Robert Rollings One Half of my land that I formerly owned before I made him a right to any and if he dies without a lawful begotten Heir the land I now leave him I give to my Daughter Pheby —
- Item 3. I give to the Heirs of my son J^{sr} Burwell Rollings D^{cd}. one half of my land that I formerly held being 140 Acres more or less for a bond that the estate has against me being agreeable to his & my bargain and if they had rather have the money for my Executors to sell the part of land that I left them to pay them to be taken of adjoining Parks Vicks D^{cd}. to them and their heirs forever —
- Item 4. I give to my Grand Daughter Polley Joyner and my Daughter Pheby all my personal Estate of every kind after the death or marriage of my wife & if Polley Joyner dies without heir I give her part of my Estate to my Daughter Pheby to her & her heirs forever —
- Item 5. I give Thomp Joyner the Bed & furniture that I leave him to him & his Heirs forever —
- Item 6. I appoint my wife Polley Rollings & Robert Rollings my executor and executrix to this my last will & testament given under my hand & seal this first day of July 1805 —
