In the name of God amen I. Jos. Carroll of the County of S^ton and parish of Motway being weak of body but sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following (Vest)

First - It is my will and desire that my loving wife Sarah Carroll may have during her life the use of the plantation whereon I now live also the three following negroes (vest) Bess, Mial and Jack, my black mare and my bay mare bridle and saddle, two feather beds and furniture two cows and calves, two Ewes and Lambs two sows and pigs and as much of my pewter and kitchen furniture as she may think proper for her use, also one box Iron and hatters Case Knives and forks, 1 chest 1 Trunk, One cart and wheels. I desire also that she shall have corn and meat sufficient for the support of her family out of the stock now in hand and to be furnished out of the ensuing crop with what may be necessary for her and her family for the following year and as many of the plantation utensils as will be sufficient for her it is also my will that my two daughters Sarah Carroll and Rebecca Carroll may as long as they live single have the use and liberty of living on the above mentioned plantation and after the death of my wife and the marriage or death of my aforesaid daughters that then the said plantation should be sold and out of the money arising from the said sale the following should be paid to the Children of my daughter Elizabeth Bailey and vizt To Nancy Bayleigh the Sum of
