

Anthony, Willis, Billy, Clabourn, James, Mason, Princy, and Franky and George, I also lend my wife all my household furniture except two beds and furniture; I also lend her all my kitchen furniture, my coaches and harness, my new riding chair and harness, my still and all the utensils belonging to the plantation wherein I now live during her life, all the above gifts and loans are in lieu of dowry at the death of my wife. I desire that the household and kitchen furniture the coaches and harness the riding chair and harness and the utensils belonging to my said plantation except the still may be sold, and the money arising from the sale I desire may be equally divided amongst all my children; the still I give to my son George to him and his heirs I also give my son George Booth Cary my tract of land known by the name of Creek quarter, which is bounded by the main run of Notoway river, the main run of the three creeks, John Applewhites line and Brownes line to him and his heirs forever.

At the death of my wife I give to my said son George the tract of land wherein I now live to him and his heirs forever: I also give to my son George the following Slaves to wit: Molly and her three children, Charles, Lucy and Willy: Jack Harris, Bob, Moses, Will, Sterling, Annishy, Willis and Charlotte; to him & his heirs forever; I also give to my said son the six horses belonging to the Creek quarter, all the stock of cattle thereon, and all the stock of hogs except those that will be fattened for sale, and for the overers provision the ensuing year, I also give to my said son my still and all the tools and implements of every kind on the said plantation: I also give to my said son twenty of the best sheep of the stock on the said plantation and also what corn may be necessary to support the plantation the ensuing year. My will and desire is that my Breckhorn and Notoway plantations be kept up, and the lands thereon and sufficiency of stock of every kind be kept thereon for the support of my five daughters untill Nancy or Peggy Cary marries or comes of age, at which time I desire that the one who marries first shall draw one half of the Slaves called the Buxton family to be possessed by her and her heirs forever, excepting the Slaves of the said family I lend to my wife; the said plantations are then to be kept up with the remainder of my Slaves not given away or lent until the other comes of age or marries, when either happens I desire she may have the remainder of the said family of Slaves and their increase excepting those I lend to my wife: the said plantation I desire may be still kept up for the benefit of the rest of my girl children untill the death of my wife, and at her death I desire the said plantation
