

may be sold at public sale together with the crops made thereon, all the stock of every kind and all the utensils and implements belonging to the said plantations and the monies arising from said sales I desire may be equally divided between my five daughters, or as many of them or their children as may be living at the death of my wife; if at that period any of my daughters should be dead and leave children, the children of the one, or of those who may be dead, are to draw of the above sale only so much as their mother or mother would have been entitled to had she or they as the case may be lived, vizt one share: the sales above last mentioned are to take place at some convenient time after the death of my wife - To prevent mistakes and disputes I think proper here to name the slaves that make the Buxton family (exclusive of those I lend my wife), which are as follows to wit. Nell, Penny, Moses, Tom, Stephen, Amos, Princy, Jim, Buxton, Dany Pink, Leisha, Bob, Elly, Silpha, Patience, Jane, Peg, Lucy, Jane David, Moses, Joshua, Jesse, Annise, Isaac, Nat. Lewis, Jerry, Cloza, Rhoda, Joe and Jack. at the death of my wife I give to to be equally divided between my daughters Nancy and Peggy Cary to them and their heirs forever: the following slaves and their increase to wit Tabitha, Cecilia Thompson, Harry, Phil, Jim, Blaney, Willis, James and Franky which said slaves were lent to my wife during her life. My share out of the Buxton family and not before given away, with their increase, I desire at the death of my wife, may be equally divided between my daughters Sally Martha and Charlotte Cary, to be possessed by them and their heirs forever: but in case either of my said daughters Sally Martha or Charlotte should marry before my wife's death the one marrying shall be entitled to her part of the said slaves in the same manner as if my wife had died. I desire that such of my stock not given away as may be thought by my executors to be unnecessary for the use of my plantations which I have desired to be kept up, may be sold and the proceeds of such sales I desire may be equally divided amongst all my children after all my just debts are paid I desire that the remaining part of my money whether in hand or to be collected may be equally divided between all my children. I give to my daughters Nancy and Peggy Cary one bed and furniture each: Lastly, I nominate and appoint Bland and Ethelred Camunas both of this County executors of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this eighteenth day of June in the year one thousand

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
