In the name of God Amen I Daniel Stanton of Southampton County being at this time weak in Body but of a sound disposing Mind and memory do dispose of my Worldly Estate which it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life in manner and form following Vizt -

Stanton I lend the use of my plantation in Southampton County wherein I now live to my loving wife Mary Stanton during her single life -

Stanton I give and bequeath to my loving Sister Sally Stanton all my part in the mill on the lightwood Swamp to her and her heirs forever -

Stanton I give to my loving Son Elwood Newby Stanton at the intermarriage or Death of his Mother all that tract of Land in Southampton County whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever -

Stanton I give and bequeath to my son Chalkley Stanton all that tract of Land in the County of Shoford to him & his heirs forever -

Stanton My will and desire is that all the remainder part of my estate be sold, both real and personal and after my just Debts are paid the balance to be equally Divided between my loving wife Mary and two Sons Elwood and Chalkley to them and their heirs forever -

And lastly I do nominate and appoint my friend William Wren to be my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and testament revoking all other Wills and testifying this and no other to be my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have herunto set my hand and seal this 12th day of December 1806
