

403 At a Court held for the County of Southampton on the 20th day of April 1807 This will was presented in Court by Samuel Boykin the Executor therein named proved by the Oath of Jordan Baker and Daniel Boykin two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded - And on the motion of the said Executor who made Oath according to law probate is granted him in Due form giving Security whereupon

In the name of God Amen - John Daughtry being low in health, but of sound mind and do make this my last will and Testament -
I wish all my just debts may be paid -
It is my will and desire that my Daughter Elizabeth Gray Daughtry may enjoy & Possess all my Estate real and Personal until she arrives to the age of eighteen years or is married, at either of those Periods I give the whole of my Estate real & Personal to her and her heirs forever - But in case she should die previous to either of the aforesaid periods, then I give all my estate as aforesaid to Jacob Daughtry son of my Brother Henry Daughtry to him and his heirs & assigns forever -
I hereby constitute and appoint my Brother Henry Daughtry and my friend John Dorton Executors to this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all others heretofore made by me - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal September 22nd 1806
