I. Absalom Williams of Southampton County Virginia, being in a
low State of Health, but thanks be to almighty God, of sound
mind and memory, calling to mind the mortality of my body,
do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner
and form following, to wit, first - I lend to my beloved wife Mary
Williams two negro men Frank and Amos; & One negro woman
Rose; for and during her natural life and at her death I give
the said two negro men, Frank and Amos to my son Henry
Williams his Heirs and assigns forever, and the said Woman
Rose, at the death of my wife, I give with her future increase
to my son George Williams his heirs and assigns forever -
Whereas Thomas Applewhite, by his last will and Testament, left a
legacy to my son George Williams - which legacy I have received, I now
leave to my said son George, in lieu of the said legacy, a negro
man called yellow Dick; provided he will make & execute to my exec^{ors}
hereafter named a full and clear acquittance of all claim which
he may have on my estate for or on the account of the aforesaid
legacy but not otherwise - And I give to my said son George
Williams, a negro boy named Jacob; a negro girl named Lucy
and one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever
