I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha A. Williams four negroes to wit, Wian Stephen Boy Dick and two girls Nancy and Annica with the increase of the two girls, and one feather bed and furniture to her & her heirs and assigns forever

Item

I give and bequeath to my son Henry Williams, my tract of land lying in Hartford County N^c Carolina, which was given to me in my fathers will, containing two hundred and fifty acres, more or less also a negro girl named Nilla a negro boy named Sam, and one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs & assigns forever

Item

I leave to my beloved wife Mary Williams all my household & Kitchen furniture three beds excepted all my plantation utensils, two horses her choice of of haves, and one third part of all my black cattle Sheep and Hogs; during her natural life and at her death, I leave the said furniture, utensils and stock, to be sold, and the profits of said sales I give in equal division to my three children above named, to them and their assigns forever

Item

I leave all the residue of my estate of every kind to be sold at my death; and the money arising from said sale, together with what may be collected of those indebted to me ~~after~~ ^{after} my just debts & necessary expenses are paid I give in equal division amongst my three children above named, to them and their assigns forever

Lastly

I hereby constitute and appoint my friend Jacob Darden executor to this my last will & testament, in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this first day of May 1806
