

I William Blunt of Southampton County and Commonwealth
of Virginia do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
in manner following —

I lend to my excellent and dear wife Elizabeth for and during her
natural life the upper part of the lands wherein I live, to be
divided by a line beginning at Pawells branch opposite the Sandy
bottom and running thro the same by a Strait line to the Swamp
near the old peach orchard; thence down the meanders of the
Swamp until it gets to the lower end of the Great fishing hole;
from thence about midway between the cave field and the old
flat neck field; thence in the same course so as to run a little
above the hickory neck hogpen. thence in the same course so as
to run a little above the middle hogpen and from thence until
it strikes the Gut which runs into Meherrin river together with
all the perishable property thereon and at the decease of my
said wife I give the aforesaid land premises and perishable
property to my son William Blunt and his heirs; but should he
die without lawful issue then and in that case I give the same
to my son John Harflett Blunt, and his heirs; but should he
die without lawful issue, then and in that case, I give the
said lands and premises to his several sisters, and their issue
lawfully begotten; to wit, to my respective daughters and their
heirs forever —

I give to my son John Harflett Blunt and his heirs all the
other of the lands above described which lie below the lands
before mentioned adjoining the Lands of Laurence Smith &
lying on the North side of Meherrin river; together with
the several tracts or parcels of land opposite thereto lying
in the Counties of Greensville and Northampton, which I own
by devise from my father, and by purchase from messrs Richard
H. Haley, Green Turner and James Brantley; together with the
perishable property thereon which may remain when my said son
John N. shall arrive to the age of nineteen; which property
with the said lands devised to him are received, and I do hereby
lend to my beloved wife until he shall come to the age above
mentioned or during my said wifes widowhood —
but it is my will and Desire that should my son
