In the name of God Amen I William Pope Gent. of St. James County State of Virginia being of perfect sound sense & memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this mortal body do make constitute and ordain this my last Will and Testament & following I am First and principally, I Will that all my lawful debts and funerals Charges be paid out of my estate. the residue and remainder of my estate I dispose of in the following manner and form following

Imprimis

I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rachel Pope for and in during her natural life or widowhood all my estate both real and personal, and after the death or my wife or her marriage as follows

Item

I give and bequeath to my daughter Rachel Barnes for and in during her natural life Seventy five Acres of Land, bounded by Isaac popes line Gally Williams line and Boston Barnes line and after the death of my Daughter Rachel Barnes I give the said Seventy five Acres of Land to my Grandson Simon Pope and his heirs forever. I also give my said daughter Rachel Barnes my negro woman Lettice & my negro girl China, and after the death of Rachel Barnes I leave said Negroe China to Nancy Pope Daughter of Simon Pope & if she does the said China to Rachel Barnes child or children

Item

I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Pope the land and plantation whereon I now live, & my negro man Freeman, my negro woman Harriah & my negro girl Annah during her life or widowhood and after her death or marriage I leave the said land and Negroes to my D. Ann Popes children

Item

I give to my Daughter Polly, Pope my Negro man Peter and my Negro girl Nancy and after the death of my Daughter Polly Pope the said Negroes to be divided among her children

Item

I leave the remainder of my estate. I leave to be equally
