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In Obedience to an order of the County Court of Southampton, we Jacob Darden and Hardy Cobb have Examined, Stated and Settled an account Current of the estate of Henry John Burgeffs dec^d and find the said estate to be indebted to the executor, the Sum of one hundred and ninety eight pounds, five shillings and five pence three farthings as appears above. In this account, however, we have omitted to Credit the Estate by amount which Col^t A. Jones, the ~~son~~, was to have received for an old negro man Joe, belonging to the Estate and which he sold on a credit to a Mr. Richardson of South Carolina at \$120. Col^t Jones states that at the particular request of Mrs Burgeffs (the widow of his Testator), from the malevolent disposition of this negro, together with his attempts and frequent threats to do mischief to the family, he felt himself bound to dispose of him at all events, That to sell him to this Mr. Richardson, on a credit, was the only opportunity which then offered of getting clear of him & that he has used every measure in his power to collect the money but has never received it. He therefore would think it a hard ship under all these circumstances to be Compelled to pay the amount for which he sold, we therefore, without offering an opinion on the Subject, Submit it, with all other of our transactions in the premises to the County Court aforesaid -
