Imprimis, I give and bequeath to the heirs of my daughter Phillany Moyes one dollar; to them and their heirs forever. Item, I give and devise unto the heirs of my son Benj^r Bryant and their heirs forever one dollar. Item, I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Bryant, one dollar to him and his heirs forever. Item, I give and bequeath unto my son John D Bryant one dollar to him and his heirs forever. Item, I give and bequeath unto my son William Bryant and his heirs forever, all the residue of my property, both real and personal, to him and his heirs forever. Item, I do hereby nominate and appoint my two friends Jacob Bennett & Lewis Wirth Executors to this my last will & Testament hereby revoking and annulling all former wills and Testaments heretofore by me made. *Wm Bryant* - whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal, this eighteenth day of December Eighteen hundred and Eight.
