 was this day returned into Court and is ordered to be recorded

Sister Samuel Hello et al:

I William Westbrook of Southampton County do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say first I will give to Miles Bemberry, the bastare son of Sally Bemberry the sum of one hundred pounds if he lives to be twenty one years old, and not to be paid to him sooner than that period, and if he should not arrive to the age of twenty one years I give him nothing —
 Item. I give to Sally Bemberry, the mother of the above said Miles Bemberry, at the expiration of one year after my decease, in case the said Sally be then living, the sum of Twenty five pounds and nothing in case she dies within the above mentioned time —
 Item. I give to Mourning Web, at the expiration of one year after my decease in case she the said Mourning be then living, the sum of Twenty five pounds; and nothing in case she dies within the above mentioned time —
 Item. I give to Rebecca Tiller and Sally Andrews my sisters and and Francis Brister my niece, each the sum of one hundred Dollars, to them and their heirs, to pay at the expiration of one year after my death —
 Item. I give to Nancy Bittle daughter of Kerby Bittle one barrel mare, named Lilly —
 Item. I give to Betsey Bittle Daughter of Kerby Bittle my riding chair and harness as it now stands —
 Item. I give to Priscilla Bittle Daughter of Kerby Bittle my negro woman Pat but in case the said Priscilla dies unmarried, or without lawful issue. I give the said negro pat to be equally divided between Nancy Bittle, Betsey Bittle, and their Brother Thomas Bittle to him and his heirs forever —
 Item. I give to Thomas Bittle son of Kerby Bittle my negro boy named Jefse, to him and his heirs forever in case he arrives to the age of twenty one years; but if he dies before he arrives to the age of twenty one years. I then give the said Negro boy Jefse to be equally divided between Nancy Bittle, Betsey Bittle, and Priscilla Bittle, to them and their heirs forever —
 Item. I give to Lucy Bittle my negro woman Mary, to her and her heirs forever but upon this special condition that the said negro woman Mary shall be under her particular direction and that the said Negro shall not be considered either as to himself or
