

any profits that may arise from the said negro by him or otherwise, to be subject to Kerby Bittle, husband of the said Lucy, or to be taken either himself, or her heirs to pay any debt of the said Kerby Bittle, but at all times and in every respect, to be under the direction of Lucy Bittle and to be disposed of at, or before her decease, in any manner she the said Lucy may think proper. I give to John Henry Person Westbrooke, two negroes, to wit, Ben and Lewis, and all my lands lying on the creek and bounded as follows to wit, by the creek, by the lands belonging to the nephews of Persons Westbrooke, by the lands belonging to Rebecca Tilton, by the lower lands of the Widow of Henry Westbrooke dec'd which said negroes and land, I give to the said John Henry Person Westbrooke to him and his heirs forever, in case he arrives to the age of Twenty one years; and if he dies under that age, I give the said land and negroes to his sister Mason Westbrooke to her and her heirs forever and if the said Mason Westbrooke dies unmarried, or without lawful issue I then desire that the said negroes and land may return to my estate; It is my will and desire that my brother Thomas Westbrooke shall manage and controul the above said negroes and land, for the use and benefit of the said John Henry Person Westbrooke, and in case of her death as above mentioned, to controul and manage the same for the use of Mason Westbrooke, and account as guardian to either of them, as the case may be, with the Court of Southampton - Item - I give to Mason Westbrooke one negro girl named Betty, to her and her heirs, but if she the said Mason dies unmarried, or without lawful issue I then give the said girl Betty to John Henry Person Westbrooke to him and his heirs forever, and if he dies under the age of Twenty one years; I then desire the said negro may return into my estate -

Item My will and desire is, that after my decease, my yellow woman named Charlotte, and her child Martha shall be emancipated by my executors, and after her emancipation, I desire my executors may furnish her out of my estate, with twelve Barrels of sound corn, one black mare named Polly, one cow and calf, one breeding sow and three hundred pounds of good pork, or in lieu of the pork, one hundred & eighty pounds of good bacon; I also desire that she may be furnished by my executors with one axe, one weeding hoe and one grubbing hoe. Item - after the emancipation of my yellow woman slave Charlotte, I desire my executors may have twenty acres of the land I bought of Ambrose Snows, laid off in the nearest part to the road, in a convenient shape, which said twenty acres of land, I give to the said Charlotte after her emancipation, to her and her heirs forever. I further desire that my executors may have built at the expence of my estate, for the said Charlotte on the land I have given her one log house

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
