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Item I give and bequeath unto my said wife my chaises and Harness, three horses eight cows and calves, one yoke of Oxen, one set of cart wheels, Twelve sheep six sows and pigs all of her own first choice, two thousand weight of pork if in the season, if not Bacon in proportion to the times of the year one fourth part of all my household and kitchen furniture & one fourth part of my plantation interally at their appraised values to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and devise unto my Daughter Eliza C. Jones my Saw and Irish Mills and all my lands on the west side of the said Mills & Mill Swamp, to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife the following slaves namely, Bob, Rex, and Galt, and all my blacksmith tools to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas C. Jones the following slaves, to wit, Phillis, Tony, Sam, Dunkin, Louisa, Basson, Kate, Henry, and Arthur to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Peggy Smith wife of Griffin Smith the following slaves namely, Aimey, Yornick, Scotland, Lizzas, Jack, old Nanny, Anney, Young Nanny, Willis & George to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza C. Jones the following slaves namely, Fanny, Abigail, Annas, Lucy, Isabel, Jo Silvia, Plumes, Harry, and Rose to her & her heirs forever.

Item It is my desire that old Belinas be supported out of the profits arising from the slaves bequeathed to my son Thomas C. Jones that old Rachel be supported out of the profits arising from those bequeathed to my daughter Peggy Smith & old Anicee out of the profits arising from those bequeathed Eliza C. Jones.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son in Law Griffin Smith the plantation commonly known by the name of the Mill plantation containing six hundred & sixty seven acres as it is executed by me to him, recorde in Southampton County Court with all the stock utensils and furniture thereon to him & his heirs forever.

Item It is my will and desire that all the residue and remaines of my lands not heretofore disposed of, to wit, meacon sein place with the lands appertaining thereto my fishery near Jones Ferry with the lands appertaining thereto one half acre of land at Adams Ferry Eight hundred and eighty nine acres of land lying & being in the state of Ohio between Little River & Miami and situate adjoining a plot of survey of Thomas Ripley & others, as a Patent granted me dated on the twenty fifth day of April one thousand eight hundred will more fully appear and the balance of the lands which join the lands heretofore
