In the name of God amen this 8th day of January, eighteen hundred & nine
I Ann Hindred of Southampton County, being in my perfect senses thanks to
God for the same & knowing that it is appointed for all to die, do make
and ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following:
first I desire to give my Soul to God who gave it me, and my body to
be decently buried by my executors and as touching what worldly goods I
possess I give and bequeath them in manner & form following:

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Hindred, one choice bed
and furniture to her and her heirs forever

I desire that my cloaths and my wearing apparels may be equally divided
between my Daughter Mary Edwards and Elizabeth Hindred

I desire that the balance of my estate of all kinds may be sold by my
executors (to be hereafter named) and the money arising from the sale thereof
after paying my just debts, may be kept in the hands of my executors and
that they make such use of the said money, for the benefit of my
Daughter Elizabeth Hindred, as they may think necessary and proper.
If my Daughter Elizabeth Hindred should die before the money shall
all be expended for the use of her the said Elizabeth Hindred, I desire
that the balance of the money remaining in the hands of my executors at
her death, may be equally divided between my Son Elisha Hindred and my
daughter Mary Edwards I do hereby constitute and appoint Heton Pope
Henry Porter & John Woodard, my executors to this my last will and
Testament, the day and year first above written
