I also give to my son Thomas Fitzhugh and his heirs, all the money that may be received from the Estate of John Persons, decd. under a deed made and passed to me for two hundred and six acres of land by the said Persons. I also give to my son Thomas, the following Slaves viz: Sami, Betty, Rhodas, and Absalom, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son Sewit at the death of my wife, the Tract of Land whereon I now live, containing three hundred and fifty six acres be the same more or less to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son Sewit the following Slaves viz: Ben and Sam, to him and his heirs forever; and at the death of my wife, I give to my son Sewit the Slaves that I lend to my wife viz: Glasgow, Monday China and Pleasant, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son Sewit at the death of my wife, my Grist mill, and Cotton Machine to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I lend to my wife during her life the following Slaves viz: Tony & Jacob, and at the death of my wife, I give the said Slaves Tony & Jacob, to my son Thomas Fitzhugh, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give to my son Sewit, one Bed and furniture, also my Colt (by Tip top) if the Colt should be living, otherwise, I give him a horse worth one hundred dollars, the money to be raised out of all my Estate also one saddle and bridle to be worth twenty dollars, the money also to be raised out of all my estate, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I also give to my son Sewit, six Cows and Calves (or yearlings as may be most convenient at that time) and one yoke of Steers, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I also give to my son Sewit six Ewes, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give to my Grand Daughter, Elizabeth Fitzhugh, daughter of my son William Fitzhugh, one negro Girl, named Winney, one bed and furniture and one hundred Dollars the money to be raised out of all my Estate should my grand daughter Elizabeth Fitzhugh, die under the age of Eighteen years or without lawful issue, it is my will, that the above mentioned property and may be equally divided between my Children.

Item, I desire that my stills may remain on my plantation for the use of my wife during her life, and at her death, I give the said stills to my son Sewit, to him and his heirs forever.

Item, after the payment of my debts, and the legacies bequeathed above, I lend the balance of my Estate of every kind, species and quality to my wife Priscilla Fitzhugh, during her life, and at her death, I give it to be equally divided amongst my Children.

Lastly, I do nominate and appoint my wife Priscilla Fitzhugh my Executrix, and my sons John & Thomas, and Spratley Williams my
