

11th I deem for the purpose of raising the aforesaid ^{past} legacies, that my negro woman I have and two children Sam and Coraas be sold, also all the rest of my estate of what kind ever now here and on a credit of 9 or 12 months and after paying my just debts and raising the above legacies, the money of my shall go as directed in this second and third items and if my executor the second and third item must make it. —

12th My will and name is, that the money arising from the sale after my wife's death, as directed in the three items be divided among the following persons in such proportion that my son Henry Collier Foster may have one share, my daughter Elizabeth one share, my daughter Rebecca Vaughan one share, my son John L. share, my two grand children heirs of my son David L. share and to my grandson James Foster L. share to them and their heirs forever also my grandsons William Foster L. share to him and his heirs forever and lastly I constitute and appoint my son Nathaniel Foster and Thomas Vaughan my Executors at this my last will and testament thereby revoking all other testaments made
