I Hannah hied of Southampton county in Virginia do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say - first I give to my son Gilbert hied one horse colt and also one cow and pigs, second I give to my son Washinton hied the rest the mare is with foal with 4 or 5 weeks I give to my daughter Rhoda hied the old mare after she has foaled also one cow and calf also two feather beds - fourth I give unto my two daughters Bessie Howell and Fiebe Best one dollar each out of the apots to be raised - fifth it is my will and desire that after the above legacies and pious of the execution of the remains of my estate may be divided equally between my three children Gilbert Washinton and Rhoda; it is my will and desire that none of my estate may be sold except to pay my just debts or my funeral charges - it is my will that Benjamin Whitfield and Thomas Brown and Matthew Brown may divide the same equally between the three above named children after the legacies paid of and Benjamin Whitfield to take in possession the two boys and their part of the property as given till they arrive to age to receive it as the girl is of age she may take her part in possession as the evidence - as stating my hand and seal this tenth day of 8 hundred and ten of the year - -

Nicholas Sebelly of the county of Southampton and late of the county of Surry and State of Virginia proposing as much soundness of mind and understanding as ever he did do make and amend that this shall be his last will and testament in manner and form following to wit - -

I do hereby appropriate all my estate in Surry as a fund for the discharge of all my debts I do hereby give unto my beloved wife Betsy all the property that came to her and was left to her by her deceased husband Thomas Sebelly of what kind ever to her and her heirs forever and I do further give unto my beloved wife Betsy after the use of my estate in Surry after paying first debts being paid during her natural life and after her death I do give and give the same unto my beloved son, namely Nicholas Sebelly to him and his heirs forever, it is my will and desire that my estate may not be appraised I do hereby appoint my loving wife Betsy and my father James Sebelly my executor and executor of this my last will and testament, and if any difficulties should arise respecting this my last will and testament as to the meaning and intent of the same it is my wish and desire that it may be referred to three respectable men whose decision shall be valid as if it had been made by the Supreme Court of the United States - - It is my last will and testament and I do hereby give and bequeath and I do hereby give and bequeath to my wife Betsy and my father James Sebelly to them and their heirs forever, it is my will and desire that my estate may not be appraised
