Will

I, Israel Beeman of Southampton county, Virginia, do make and ordain this last
will and testament in manner and form following.

I leave the lands and plantation known to me and together with the same I have
been in a 1000 acre, slave lands to my wife Elizabeth Beeman and my son Nathaniel
Beeman to be held and enjoyed by them equally until the death of my said wife
and then I give the same to my said son Nathaniel Beeman to him and his assigns
forever upon the proviso following to wit, that if he the said Nathaniel Beeman should
die without lawful issue, I then give the said lands to be held for a period of
twelve months and proceeds of the said sale to be equally divided among all my
children then living, and the survivors of those that are dead (the latter to
take pro rata).

I then I give to my son Nathaniel Beeman one cow and calf, one ewe and lamb
one huffer and twelve dollars cash to him and his heirs forever.

Then I leave to my wife Elizabeth Beeman during her lifetime life one bed
and furniture, one table, walnut table, one wooden bed, glass, leather chair, one desk
one green painted chest, wooden wheel and cart, one burning iron, two cows two
calves, one sow and pigs, one ewe and lamb, one horse to the value of forty dollars
and fifteen dollars cash and at her death I give the same to be sold at the price
of one sale to be equally divided amongst my seven children.

I then, all the residue of my estate of whatever nature I leave to be sold at my
death and the proceeds of said sale to be equally divided amongst all my chil-
dren then living and the survivors of those that are dead. Sarah Harris
Abraham Beeman Rachel Harrell Benjamin Beeman, Peggy Jane Beeman
Harrell Nathaniel Beeman and my grandson Abraham Beeman which
I give to them and their assigns forever.

Lastly I hereby nominate and appoint my son Abraham Beeman and my son
in law John Harrell and my approved Jacob Edwards executor of this
my last will and testament, in witness whereof I have set my hand and
affixed my seal this 18th day of May 1848.
