

In obedience to an order (minutes annexed) of the Court of Southampton County, we as directed bearing date March sixteenth, 1809 the subscribers have examined the books to us produced by the executor James Lindsay and find that they agree with the charges as stated and settled by us in the within account current and we also find a balance due from the estate of Williams Lindsay to the said executor of ~~money~~ pounds eighteen shillings and 6^{ths} with legal interest thereon from the twenty fifth of December 1809 till payment. --
