I, Lucy Nicholas of Southampton being sick and weak of body but of
sound mind and disposing memory do make and bear this to be my last
will and testament in manner and form following: My first I give my
body to God who gave it me and my body to be decently buried at the discretion
of my executor hereafter to be named, as to my worldly estate in manner and
form following:—

Item I give to my son Thos. Nicholas all such articles as I have heretofore given him
also all such articles of household furniture that he has of mine in possession what
by loan or otherwise to him and his heirs forever —

Item I give to my son Thos. Nicholas the following article: My ironing table and its
apparatus, 1 feather bed and furniture that I left at his house, likewise the stock of hay
& and crop of corn and all the furniture that was on the plantation when he took possession
thereof, also all the articles of household furniture that remains of mine on his plantation
and was not sold by me at the sale of mine when I broke up housekeeping, also all articles
that I have heretofore given him to him and his heirs forever —

Item I give unto my daughter Mary Nicholas all the articles that I have heretofore
given her, and that she has in possession, also twenty five dollars in cash to be raised
for her out of some bond that is due my estate to her and her heirs forever —

Item I give unto my daughter Mary Briggs wife of William Briggs all the articles of property that
I have heretofore given her, also all the articles of household furniture that I brought with
me when I came to William Briggs to live (I do not intend to settle accounts of real estate in-
cluded in the above legacy) to her and her heirs forever —

Item I give to my friend Mary Briggs daughter of Nathaniel Briggs the sum of
twenty five dollars in cash to be raised out of some bond due my estate to her
and her heirs forever —

Item I desire and desire it that my executor hereafter to be named furnish and pay
my wife and mine with five yards of good virginia cloth each to make their clothes
at about two shillings and six pence or three shillings for yard —

Item It is my will and desire that whereas I have bonded myself this year at the
house of William Briggs at forty dollars per year and have been for a very long
