I give and bequeath unto my brother Amos Lowe and his heirs forever all my plantations and lands now proper supposed to be one hundred and sixteen acres by the same more or less, provided the said Amos Lowe pay the said taxes due by all my just debt and on this special condition the said Amos Lowe by all my just debt and on this special condition the said Amos Lowe his heirs or assigns is to enjoy the said land and premises as the same never had been any incumbrance thereon and all and every other part of my estate of what nature or kind whatever to him and his heirs forever. I appoint my brother Amos Lowe my heir and sole executor to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of September one thousand eight hundred eleven.

I Samuel Lowe of Southhampton County Virginia being weak in body but of sound mind and memory render thanks to God for the same do make and declare the following writing my last will and testament - To wit.

I send unto my loving wife Rebecca Lowe my mare untill my son Jacob Lowe arrives to the age of twenty years. I also send her the use and profits of one third part of my plantations and lands during her life and I give and bequeath unto my said wife twenty pounds cash and one feather bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

I then I give and bequeath unto my son Lawrence Lowe five dollars cash and all the property he already hath in possession to him and his heirs forever. I then I give and devise and bequeath unto my son Jacob Lowe all my lands and ~~my~~ plantations, except as my wife third part during her life) one feather bed and furniture and my mare when he comes to the age of twenty years and to his heirs forever.

I then I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Patsy one bed and furniture.

I then It is my will and desire that my niece that my executor hereafter named, sell my negro boy Emanuel and with the money arising from said sale pay my proportion of a debt due to to grow due from Patsy Lambport to the Blues for which suit is instituted in Southhampton County Court and for which claims the negroes belonging to the said Elizabeth or
